
David and Goliath

1 Samuel 17:1-11, 32-51



During a battle between the Philistines and the Israelites, a Philistine giant named Goliath challenged the Israelites. "Do we need a whole army to settle this?" he asked. "Choose someone to fight for you, and I will fight for the Philistines. We will settle this fight in a single combat."


